On November 21, 2025, Governor Murphy issued a writ of election to fill the vacancy in the U.S. House of Representatives for New Jersey’s 11th Congressional District created by the resignation of Representative Mikie Sherrill, Governor-elect of New Jersey, who resigned from office effective 11:59 p.m. on Thursday, November 20, 2025.

The special primary election will be held on February 5, 2026 and the special general election will be held on April 16, 2026.

2025 AND PRIOR YEAR(S) OPEN PROPERTY TAX AND WATER
AND SEWER CHARGES

As 2025 comes to a close, please be sure that your tax, water and sewer charges are paid up-to-date. All open 2025 and prior year balance(s) will be subject to further action including, but not limited to, tax sale and water shut off. If your open charges are subject to tax sale, a lien will be placed on your property. If your 2025 charges remain open, are over \$10,000.00 and extend into 2026, they will be subject to a 6% year-end penalty in addition to established interest. For information regarding your payoff amount or if you have questions, please contact the tax department at 973-989-7048/7047 or the water and sewer department at 973-989-7063.

REMINDER! As we enter the holiday season, please remember to pay your 4th quarter water and sewer bill. The bills were mailed on November 14, 2025 and are due no later than December 15, 2025. Questions may be directed to 973-989-7063/7047.

An advertisement from THE IRON ERA newspaper of December 9, 1904 assisted Randolph’s holiday shoppers with any dilemmas on what to get for the young or older man in their life during the Christmas holiday. W.P. Turner & Company was a gentleman’s haberdashery on the corner of Blackwell and Sussex streets in Dover, whose proprietor, William P. Turner, lived at 17 West Blackwell Street with his wife Annie and 3 children, noted as a “Merchant” in the U.S. Census.

Protect Your Water Meter and Pipes for Winter

You are probably aware that your water pipes could freeze during the winter months, but did you know that your water meter could also freeze if not properly protected? A frozen water meter would not only be an inconvenience, but an unexpected expense. A technician would be sent from the township to replace the frozen water meter; however, the customer would be responsible for the cost of replacement. Steps you can take to protect your pipes and water meter include:

- Ensuring that the water meter is located in a heated area such as a basement crawl space, out of the wind and weather.
- Wrapping water lines or meters with insulation and/or heat if they are not in a properly heated area, or are in an area prone to freezing.
- Allowing one of your faucets to run slowly in extreme cold, or if your pipes have frozen in the past, especially those farthest from where the main line enters the house or on outside walls. This helps prevent costly damage to meters, pipes, or property — a slight increase in your water bill is far less expensive than replacement.

Snow Removal Ordinance

Under Township Ordinance #44-83:

- **Clear sidewalks and ramps:** Property owners, tenants, and occupants must remove snow and ice from sidewalks and accessibility ramps next to their property. This must be done within **12 hours of daylight after a snowfall or ice accumulation.**
- **If removal isn't possible:** When ice is too thick to remove, sidewalks and ramps must be treated with sand, salt, ashes, or sawdust within **6 hours of daylight.**
- **Keep streets clear:** Snow and ice from private property may **not** be shoveled, plowed, or deposited onto sidewalks, ramps, roads, or streets.

These rules help keep our community safe and walkable during winter weather. Thank you for doing your part!

Fire Department News

Fireplace and Chimney Safety

Fireplaces and chimneys require a high degree of maintenance including seasonal cleaning by a licensed chimney sweep to clean the buildup of creosote, a black tar-like, wood burning by-product which can cause a chimney fire.

Use the three feet rule by keeping children, pets and burnable materials at least three feet away from any heat source.

- DO NOT use lighter fluid or flammable liquid to light a fire.
- Use only seasoned wood stacked in cords away from any structure.
- Check that the damper is open before lighting the fire.
- Failure to do so can result in an accumulation of smoke and carbon monoxide within the home.
- Do not close the damper before the fire has died out and the embers are cold.
- Use a tempered glass fireplace screen to prevent popping sparks and flying embers from landing on the floor.
- Check that the damper is open.

Fire Department Actives:

- Christmas trees are here! Millbrook Fire Co. #2 sells the trees as a fundraiser to support the fire house. Stop by to purchase your Christmas tree now; open 7 days per week
- Santa visits sections of Randolph via fire truck on December 20, 2025 – Follow social media for routes

IMPORTANT NOTICE - SNOW RULES:

Randolph Township encourages all residents to follow these guidelines during the winter months so that the Public Works Department can maintain your roads to the best of their ability.

Snow into the Roadway: Please do not deposit snow into the roadway either by plowing, snow blowing, or shoveling. Whether you or your contractor deposits the snow into the road, it is against the Township Ordinance. This creates a hazard for our plowing operators. All snow should be plowed, blown, or shoveled onto your property.

Garbage Cans: Please do not place your cans in the road for garbage pickup. The drivers cannot take the time to stop plowing and move the garbage cans out of the way. Cans should be placed behind the curb and far enough back so the snow coming off the plow will not strike your garbage can. The garbage men will step onto your property to retrieve the can.

Basketball Posts: Please remove all basketball posts that are located within the road or the road right of way. These posts and backboards can produce damage to the Public Works Department's equipment while performing snow related duties.

Vehicle Parking: Any time that there is snow, vehicles are not permitted to be parked on the streets of Randolph Township. This is a Township Ordinance and is subject to fine. To avoid snow from hitting your vehicle when the plows pass, please do not park your vehicle close to the roadway.

Adhering to these guidelines will make the job of the Public Works Department much easier and will provide residents with the best possible service during snow events.

Randolph Township Recycling Guidelines

Recyclables must be placed curbside no later than 6:00 AM; ideally they should be put out the night before collection. Recyclables must be placed in reusable containers, NOT in plastic bags. In the event of inclement weather, please visit www.randolphnj.org or call the Health Department at 973-989-7050 to determine if curbside collection has been canceled.

Acceptable recycling materials for curbside collection

ALL of these items can be placed together in ONE container:	ACCEPTABLE – All must be empty, free of food debris, and rinsed
Household Plastic Containers	Plastic containers numbered 1, 2, & 5 , juice boxes and other wax coated beverage cartons.
Aluminum & Metal Cans	Aluminum foil wrap, foil trays, and foil juice pouches. Includes aluminum, tin and steel food cans.
Glass Bottles & Jars	Clear, green/blue & brown beverage and food containers.
Newspapers, Magazines, Catalogs, Books, and Phonebooks	Includes ads, inserts, postcards, hard cover, soft cover, and miscellaneous paper.
Cardboard (corrugated/chip board)	All corrugated paper materials, chipboard: cereal boxes, gift boxes, scrap paper, egg cartons, paper cups, paper tubes, and wrapping paper.
Mixed Office Paper	Includes mail, envelopes, copy paper, office paper, and greeting cards.

Acceptable items to be dropped off at the Recycling Center

These items may be dropped off at the Recycling Center for no fee, or call the Health Department to arrange for curbside pickup (a fee may be charged). If you have questions about whether an item is acceptable, please call the Health Department.

RECYCLABLE ITEM	ACCEPTABLE
Electronic Waste	Televisions, computers, laptops, monitors, computer peripherals such as keyboards and mice, fax machines, VCRs and radios.
White Goods/Appliances/Metal	Large household appliances: stoves, refrigerators, washers, dryers, dishwashers, etc. Metal includes lawn chair frames and filing cabinets.
Grass Clippings	Available seasonally.
Brush/Tree Branches	Basic yard debris. Maximum acceptable branch size is 4 feet in length by 4 inches in diameter. (No stumps)
Christmas Trees	Trees must be bare, with no stands, plastic bags, ornaments, lights, tinsel, etc. (Trees put out after January 5th WILL NOT be picked up by the township. Trees can be dropped off any time during normal working hours at the Recycling Center)
Leaves	Fall curbside collection per Department of Public Works schedule.
Tires – automobile, truck, and bike tires	Up to four tires. Remove steel rims which also can be recycled with metal.
