What’s New on the Trails

The Randolph, NJ trail system is continuously evolving to enhance the experience for its users. Here are some recent updates:

1. **Trail Expansion:** The township is actively working on expanding the trail network, with new connections like the Old Shunpike Road/Patriots Path Connector and Liberty Village to James Andrews Park being prioritized.
2. **Rosenfarb Park** is set to undergo redevelopment, which includes plans for a new basketball court. This initiative is part of a broader effort to enhance the park's facilities and provide more recreational opportunities for the northern section of the community.

3. **Fairy Trail:** A whimsical addition to the Brundage Preserve, the Randolph Fairy Trail features tiny fairy houses crafted by the community. It is open from May to November and offers a magical experience for visitors.
4. **Trail Maintenance and Master Plan Updates:** The Trails Advisory Committee has updated the Trails Master Plan, focusing on improving connectivity and maintaining the core trail network. The Master Plan is posted on the Township website. The Circulation Element of the Township Master Plan includes proposed trail expansion.
- Combs Hollow trail** – the trail was widened at the end at Combs Hollow Road and the parking area was resurfaced.
5. **Community Involvement:** The Township is planning to start a survey of the Parks and Recreation facilities. It is in its early stages and resident input will begin around the fall. All residents are encouraged to participate. The survey will help shape the future of the parks and recreational facilities in town.
